

Dear Families,

Please join us. We are in an unprecedented time in the history of our nation. The pandemic revealed significant flaws in the child care system, and remedies including a substantial financial investment have been discussed in recent years. However, now, funding for early childhood is at risk of being significantly cut and programs and tax credits that benefit children and families may be eliminated. Every Congressional representative needs to understand the vital nature of child care and the need to act now.

Child care is important, not only because it helps parents to be a vital part of the workforce, but also because the early childhood years are a critical time in every child's development and learning. The quality of environments for young children matter – meaning that child care matters. This means that a public investment is essential to provide the quality care that parents need, and our children deserve.

The South Carolina Association for the Education of Young Children, our state affiliation of the National Association for the Education of Young Children, is engaged in a campaign to highlight this need for action in support of child care. We need your help. We are launching a social media campaign during the Week of the Young Child, April 7-11, 2025, to let our representatives know that we need affordable, available, quality child care.

Take these steps:

- 1. Get a sticker from your child's child care program.
