Title: The Power of Play: The Role of Children's Museums in Kindergarten Readiness Presenter: Catie Davis

Description: I designed Pop-Up Classrooms because of the need for kindergarten readiness programming in our area. I wanted to create a program that helped children and their caregivers

prepare for kindergarten in a fun, memorable, and impactful way. The program is based on state and local assessment data: the South Carolina Kindergarten Readiness Assessment, The Spartanburg Academic Movement's Early Development Instrument (EDI), and South Carolina First Step's Profile of a Ready Kindergartner.

My research focuses on how play and parental interactions at the museum affect kindergarten readiness. Participants are chosen based on a point-based application to make the process more equitable. The summer will begin with a pre-assessment to determine a baseline for the child's school readiness and the caregiver's interactions. We will have weekly check-ins and end the summer with a post-assessment. I will use interviews, observations, and an assessment to track their progress. The goal is for the child and their caregiver to be more comfortable in the classroom setting and feel better prepared for the school year.
